MIA Election & Compliance Commission Annual Report for the Year 2021

Role of the Election and Compliance Commission (ECC):

As per the Constitution (Article VII – Section 1), the Election and Compliance Commission (ECC) is responsible for the following three tasks:

- 1. The ECC shall oversee all aspects of the elections/bi-elections process as provided in the by-Laws.
- 2. The ECC shall call a Special or Extra-Ordinary Meeting in accordance with the guidelines provided in this Constitution and the associated By-laws
- 3. The ECC has the duty to bring any violations related to Constitution and by-laws to the attention of the Board of Directors for resolution and ensure compliance. The Board of Directors shall give the ECC full access to the information needed to resolve the violation(s).

2021 Complaints Received by ECC:

There were no complaint cases received by ECC during the year 2021.

2021 General Elections:

As per the Constitution (Article VIII - Elections), ratified in October 20th, 2019, ECC called for General Elections for three (3) elected Board of Directors positions for a 3-year term, in addition to one (1) elected Board of Directors position for a 2-year term to fill a board position that became vacant during the first year in its term. The details are as follows:

- Nominations for all four (4) Board of Directors positions were opened on Wednesday, October 20th, 2021 and will be closed on Wednesday, November 10th, 2021.
- Only three (3) candidates were nominated for the 3-year term positions, and accordingly ECC announced that all candidates listed below are the new Board of Directors by acclamation effective January 1st, 2022:
- 1. Br. Idris Elbakri
- 2. Br. Muhammad Faraz Khan
- 3. Sr. Rachel Wiebe Skouta
- The remaining vacant board position for a 2-year term will be filled by appointment.
